A Look at Out of State Foster Care Adoption

Out of State Foster Care adoptions occur when a child is placed in foster care in another state and the parental rights of the biological parents have been terminated or have been filed for termination. Families can choose the age, race, and gender of their child. Adoptive families will get knowledge of medical, educational and family background information on the child. Normally, Out of State Foster Care can move very quickly and many children come with a subsidy through their sending state. Many of the children that are placed in Out of State Foster Care have emotional, developmental, or medical needs and many of these children have experienced abuse, neglect, or trauma. The goal of Out of State Foster Care is to find children permanent homes.

Who Should Adopt From Foster Care?

- Individuals at least 21 years of age (single, married or divorced)
- Any family who is not interested in raising a child from infancy.
- A family who is looking for an older child.
- A family that is looking for a sibling group.
- Families that are open to a child with emotional, developmental, or medical needs.
